Thunderbirds Charities Awards \$50,000 to Florence Crittenton

Funds will support the health and wellness of girls and young women in Arizona

PHOENIX—Thunderbirds Charities, the charitable giving arm of the Thunderbirds – hosts of the Waste Management Phoenix Open Presented by The Ak-Chin Indian Community – recently awarded \$50,000 to Florence Crittenton to support its Girls Living Program. The funds will assist in the purchase of a van that will help the 120-year-old agency better serve the health and wellness of atrisk girls and young women throughout Arizona.

"We are elated with Thunderbirds Charities' generosity to our organization," said Dr. Kellie M. Warren, Florence Crittenton's Chief Executive Officer. "Because of the Thunderbirds, we have been able to update our aging fleet that will significantly increase our ability to provide the girls in our Therapeutic Group Home with the best medical care."

The van will be used to transport girls in the Therapeutic Group Home (TGH) to their doctor appointments and other offsite visits with specialized medical practitioners. The TGH annually provides a safe, home-like environment for 200 girls, ages 10 to 18, who are involved with foster care, juvenile justice and behavioral health systems. While enrolled in the TGH, girls learn to address and overcome trauma while also benefiting from services designed for their holistic development, which includes health and wellness.

"Florence Crittenton has such a tremendous impact on at-risk young women in our community and we excited to support such a great mission," said Dan Mahoney, President of Thunderbirds Charities.
